of Nevada Grant Office services rendered during December 2017

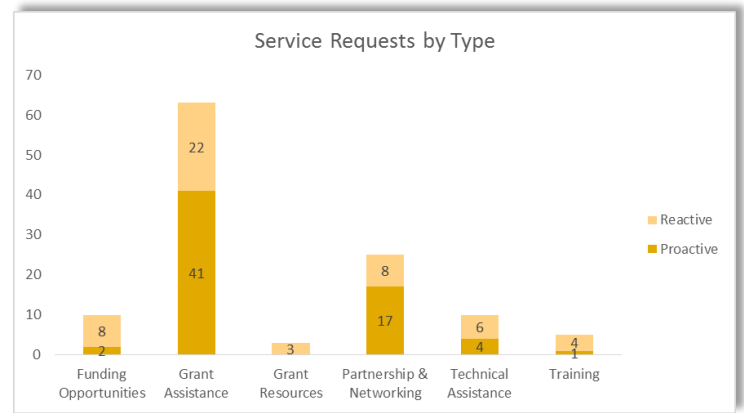


The Grant Services Tracker launched in December 2017 so that Grant Office (GO) staff could track all grant-related activities on a daily and ongoing basis. This monthly report aims to provide a snapshot of that data and work toward comparative data for the upcoming months and years. The Grant Services Guide provides a detailed explanation of the data collected, as well as the GO procedures for every aspect of data tracking and reporting. Service Requests

The Grant Office provided a total of 116 service requests (SRs).

- 51 (44.0%) were reactive and 65 (56.0%) were proactive
- 63 (54.3%) were grant assistance requests
 - The top three grant assistance activities were listserv distribution of funding opportunity announcements (27 SRs, 23.2%); Notifications of grant award (10 SRs, 8.6%); and Single Point of Contact (SPOC) review requests (6, 5.2%)
 - 6 grants received a total of 21 SRs (18.1% of December SRs)
- Partnership & Networking accounted for an additional 22% of December's service requests



Grants

The Grant Office provided SRs related to 48 unique grants in December.

- 2 types of funding from 19 unique funders: 17 (89.5%) federal agencies and 2 (10.5%) state agencies
- 39 (81.3%) were competitive and 9 (18.7%) were formulary
- 29 (60.4%) were identified as future funding opportunities that represent a total award opportunity of \$50.2M and were sent to a total of 15,199 listserv recipients throughout the state
 - 29 (100%) were competitive opportunities
 - 4 (13.8%) required a match

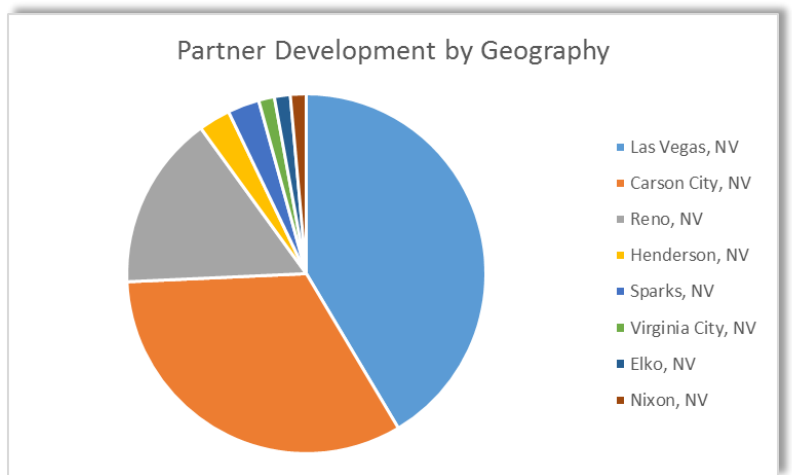
Based on available data, of the 8 funded grants that have been reported to the Grant Office YTD:

- Total \$4.7M
- 8 (100%) are formulary grants
- 2 (25%) required a match
- 8 (87.5%) are for existing grants and 1 (12.5%) is for a new grant
- 8 (87.5%) impact Nevada statewide and 1 (12.5%) is rural

Partners

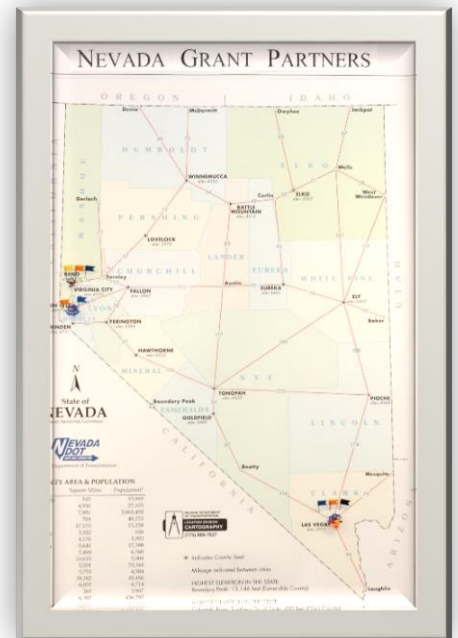
A total of 80 partners were served by Grant Office staff in December 2017.

- 70 (87.5%) were flagged for further development
- Geographically, Las Vegas received the most partner development (41.4%), followed by Carson City (32.9%), and Reno (15.7%).
- State agencies represented the most requestors (42.9%), followed by nonprofits (20%), and local agencies (18.6%). Elected officials (7.1%) led the rest of the requestors: businesses (5.7%), citizens (4.3%), and tribal agencies (1.4%)
- Grant advocates (37.5%) and grant professionals (27.5%) together represented two-thirds of requestors. Grant seekers (22.5%) and grant givers (12.5%) made up the remaining one-third.
